Outline of Active Learning Strategies

Discussions, Reflections and Interactive Reading Assignments: You will be provided with a discussion prompt relevant to in class reading. You will be expected to respond to the prompt as well as provide commentary to other students that provides constructive reflection. Both responses to the prompt and commentary to other students should display a deep understanding of readings and reflections. The nature of responses to others should be structured by asking questions and / or respectfully debating positions with supporting biblical facts, research and information. Last, it is an ongoing expectation that students respond to any follow-up questions and prompts from the instructor.

Think-Pair-Share: The instructor will provide a question based on the course topic(s) and students will share their reflection with at least one other member of the class.

Team-Based Learning: Students will be grouped to complete an activity as a team.

Concept Maps: Students will be provided with drawings or diagrams to illustrate mental connections to the course topics and major concepts in the bible.

What's the Principle? Students will be provided with concepts from the list of "Member Expectations" as well as "The Seven Principles of Life" and asked to state or write the principle that best applies to each expectation.

Supplemental Materials

The Seven Principles of Life: A principle is an unchangeable law so by engrafting these principles (laws), we may recognize when, how, and where we violate these principles (laws) and suffer the consequences. Wisdom has builded her house; she has hewn out her SEVEN pillars: Proverbs 9:1.

1. **Design** – God has precise purpose for every person, object and relationship He has established. Only by understanding and following these that we find our identity and fulfillment in life. The goal is SELF ACCEPTANCE.
2. **Responsibility** – We will be held personally accountable for every word, thought, action, attitude and motive. Therefore, if we sin, we must confess and repent. The goal is A GOOD CONSCIENCE.
3. **Authority** – God has ordained a structure and balance of authority. God has also ordained that with the proper attitude and wise appeal those who are under authority will have a far-reaching influence. The goal is PROPER SUBMISSION.
4. **Suffering** – God has ordained that we shall receive grace for personal cleansing, growth and achievement by properly responding to the offences of others. The goal is FULL FORGIVENESS.
5. **Ownership** – God allows us to conquer anger and worry by acknowledging that all that we have is from God and belongs to Him. Based on this we yield our rights and expectations to God. The goal is RIGHT YIELDING.
6. **Freedom** – Godly freedom is not the right to do what I want to do but the power to do what I ought to do. The freedom that God has ordained in morals and finances allows us to serve others in love. The goal is PURE MOTIVES.

7. **Success** – Our knowing that God conquered the world, flesh, and the devil through the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Now by engrafting the Holy Scriptures into our souls and renewing our minds with these truths day and night we can have the power of God and live above the law of sin. The goal is MEDITATION.

Covenant Agreement

After the completion of the class, please read and complete the agreement below then return the agreement to your instructor or assigned mentor to receive your completion certificate, which formally establishes you as a member of Christ Temple All Cultures Ministries. If you have questions, you can follow-up with your instructor or assigned mentor.

Covenant Purpose

The primary purposes of this covenant are:

1. to establish teaching and doctrinal parameters for Christ Temple All Cultures Ministries.
2. to clarify the obligations and expectations of members of Christ Temple All Cultures Ministries.

What We Believe

- 1. Scriptures** - We believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the verbally inspired word of God, the final authority for faith and life, inerrant in the original writings, infallible, and God-breathed (2 Tim. 3:16-17; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Matt. 5:18; John 16:12-13).
- 2. The Godhead** - We believe in one True God, the eternal sovereign Creator and Sustainer of all things. The One True God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel. Who is declared by scriptures to be Omnipresent, Omnipotent, and Omniscient (Deut. 6:4; Mal. 2:10).
- 3. The Person and Work of Christ** - We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ is the Son of God, conceived by the Holy Ghost and born of the Virgin Mary in order that He might reveal the Father and redeem sinful man. We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, became man without ceasing to be God, having been conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary in order that He might reveal God and redeem sinful man, by living the perfect, God-honoring life sinners could not live (John 1:1-2, 14; Luke 1:35). We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ accomplished our redemption through His death on the cross as a representative, vicarious, substitutionary sacrifice, and that our justification is made sure by His literal, physical resurrection from the dead (Rom. 3:24; 1 Peter 2:24; Eph. 1:7; 1 Peter 1:3-5). We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven and is now exalted at the right hand of God where, as our High Priest, He fulfills the ministry as Representative, Intercessor, and Advocate (Acts 1:9-10; Heb. 7:25, 9:24; Rom. 8:34; 1 John 2:1-2). We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ is coming again to judge the living and the dead. (1 Peter 4:5; Rom. 14:9; 2 Tim. 4:1). His second coming will bring about the restoration of all things to God (Acts 3:20-21; Col. 1:15-16, 19-20; Rev. 21:1-5).
- 4. The Person and Work of the Holy Spirit** - We believe in the Holy Ghost who was sent by the Father to convict the world of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment; He is the Supernatural Agent in regeneration, baptizing all believers into the body of Christ, indwelling and sealing them unto the day of redemption (John 16:8, 11; 2 Cor. 3:6; 1 Cor. 12:12-14; Rom. 8:9; Eph. 5:18).
- 5. Total Depravity** - We believe that man was created in the image and likeness of God, but through Adam's sin the race fell, inherited a sinful nature, and became alienated from God; man is totally depraved and of himself utterly unable to remedy his lost condition (Gen. 1:26-27; Rom. 3:22-23; 5:12; Eph. 2:1-3, 12).
- 6. Salvation** - We believe that salvation is the gift of God brought to man by grace through the work of the Holy Spirit and received by personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, whose precious blood was shed on Calvary for the forgiveness of our sins (Eph. 1:7; 2:8-10; John 1:12; 1 Peter 1:18-19).
- 7. Eternal Security and Assurance of Believers** - We believe that all the redeemed, once saved, are

kept by God's power and are thus secure in Christ, forever sealed by the Holy Spirit (John 6:37, 40; John 10:27, 30; Rom. 8:1, 38-39; 1 Cor. 1:4, 8; 1 Peter 1:5; Eph. 1:13-14). We believe that it is the privilege of believers to rejoice in the assurance of their salvation through the testimony of God's Word, which clearly forbids the use of Christian liberty as an occasion for the flesh (Rom. 13:13-14; Gal. 5:13; Titus 2:11, 15).

8. **Ministry and Spiritual Gifts** - We believe that God is sovereign in the bestowing of spiritual gifts. However, it is the believer's responsibility through the work of the Holy Spirit to develop their spiritual gift(s). We believe that particular spiritual gift(s) are neither essential, nor prove the presence of the Holy Spirit, nor are an indication of deep spiritual experience (1 Cor. 12:7, 11, 13; Eph. 4:7-8). We believe that God does hear and answer the prayer of faith, in accordance with His own will, for the sick and afflicted (John 15:7; 1 John 5:14-15). We believe that it is the privilege and responsibility of every believer to minister according to the gift(s) and grace of God that is given to him (Rom. 12:1, 8; 1 Cor. 13; 1 Peter 4:10-11).

9. **The Church** - We believe that the church, which is the body and espoused bride of Christ, is a spiritual organism made up of all those whose faith is in Christ (Eph. 1:22-23; 5:25, 27; 1 Cor. 12:12, 14; 2 Cor. 11:2). We believe that the establishment and continuance of the local church is clearly taught and defined in the New Testament Scriptures (Acts 14:27; 18:22; 20:17; 1 Tim. 3:1, 3; Titus 1:5, 11). We believe in the autonomy of the local churches, free of any external authority and control (Acts 13:1, 4; 15:19, 31; 20:28; Rom. 16:1, 4; 1 Cor. 3:9, 16; 5:4, 7, 13; 1 Peter 5:1, 4). We recognize believer's baptism and the Lord's Supper as scriptural means of testimony for the church (Matt. 28:19-20; Acts 2:41-42; 18:8; 1 Cor. 11:23, 26).

Obligations of Christ Temple All Cultures Ministries Members

The members of Christ Temple All Cultures Ministries are a body of believers who have covenanted together to live as members of God's family. The obligations of this covenant are not an addition to the obligations of believers as taught in the Bible. Instead, this section is a summary of what the Bible teaches about the transformed life that faith produces in one who is filled by the Holy Spirit.

- **Faith** - You profess faith in Jesus Christ and His shed blood, death, burial, and resurrection as the only possible means of eternal salvation from sin and death that is granted to you freely according to God's grace alone (Rom. 1:16-17; 3:22-23; 5; 2 Cor. 5:14-21; Eph. 2:1-10).
